<b>Service:</b>	Small Animal Emergency and Critical Care Rotation

Students are also required to attend a) Radiology orientation from 7-7:15 a.m. (unless they have already had radiology); and b) the CAH Scheduling / Admissions / Discharge Operations orientation (unless they have already been oriented on SA Medicine or SA Surgery) from 7:30-8 a.m. the first day of each rotation block.
