

Evaluating a New Drug Combination to Treat Dogs With Lymphoma

GOALS Lymphoma is a devastating disease that can affect all species and sometimes treatment options are limited. Currently new drugs are being investigated that would aid in the treatment of lymphoma which would expand the options for owners.

ELIGIBILITY Dogs seen by the Cornell University Hospital for Animals (or the Cornell University Veterinary Specialists) Oncology Service with previously untreated B-cell lymphoma with measurable disease and no significant other illnesses.

COMPENSATION Blood work above and beyond standard of care and all of the study related medications will be provided to you free of charge. In addition, you will receive \$1000 towards lymph node removal and treatment.

OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES If you agree to let your dog participate in this study, you will be asked to enroll in another trial currently offered to remove an affected lymph node. After that your dog will return to the Cornell University Hospital for Animals or the Cornell University Veterinary Specialists after beginning the trial for weekly rechecks for 8 weeks, then every other week for an additional 8 visits (6 months total for the study).
